## **SOCIOLOGY**

## Time Allowed - 1.5 hours

Instructions to candidates: 2 questions should be attempted.

- 1. Drawing on specific examples, discuss how notions of the self are defined through reference to an 'other'.
- 2. Globalisation is leading to a homogenisation of individual and group identity. Evaluate this statement through reference to specific examples.
- 3. Using specific examples, discuss how a sociological approach might help us understand the relationship between power and resistance.
- 4. How does social change come about?
- 5. How might sociologists question and qualify recent populist debates about identity and politics?
- 6. How does a sociological approach help us to understand how social inequalities are created and the ways in which they might be alleviated?
- 7. What are the key institutions and processes that have helped to define the role of women in society? How have women sought to define these roles?
- 8. Discuss how a sociological approach might help to improve one area of public policy in the UK.
- 9. Who is the theorist that you have found to be most useful when studying Sociology at A level? Justify your choice.
- 10. Former Prime Minister of the UK, Margaret Thatcher, maintained that there was no such thing as society. Write an essays that supports her argument, drawing on specific examples.
